Florence PD warns of recent email, phone scam

Multiple Florence residents have reported being contacted by individuals via telephone or email advising them they have been defrauded, and they need to repay the financial institution.

These payments are facilitated by the victim buying prepaid credit or gift cards and providing redemption information to the suspect(s) over the phone or via email. Similar incidents have been reported in the past in Lane County.

Citizens are reminded tics, timelines, or pressure that this is not legitimate activity and financial institutions do not utilize ficial payments.

Citizens are encouraged to hang up the phone if they suspect a scam, and report scams to your local law enforcement agency.

Calls asking for payment through untraceable methods such as prepaid cards, gift cards, or other cash cards, are probably a scam.

• One where the suspect(s) will offer to "fix" an issue if you give them remote access to your computer, then obtain financial information via that means. Be extremely cautious in giving anyone remote access to your computer.

• The other is a call Calls that use scare tac- from someone (often times a computerized message) advising that they are from Social Security or the I.R.S. and there has been "fraud" involving your account, and if you do not "cooperate" in providing payment or additional financial institution information they will issue a warrant.
