Regional fire crews battle 500-acre fire near Mapleton

Oregon Department of Forestry firefighters, along with Lane County Sheriff's Office, WLAD and firefighters from Mapleton, Swisshome/Deadwood and SVFR, responded to reports of multiple wildfires along a three-mile stretch of Sweet Creek Road near Mapleton. 
