Lane County named to state's coronavirus watch list

Brown placed Gov. Lane County on the state's COVID-19 watch list following a two-week increase in confirmed cases in the county. This was intended to help prioritize resources and assistance to counties that are seeing the broadest spread of COVID-19.

Governor extends 19 State of Emergency

Gov. Brown extended her declaration of a COVID-19 state of emergency for an additional 60 days, until Jan. 2, 2021.

'The second wave of COVID-19 has arrived in the U.S., and this time it is hitting all of our communities," Brown said.


Oregon receives **COVID-19 vaccines**
