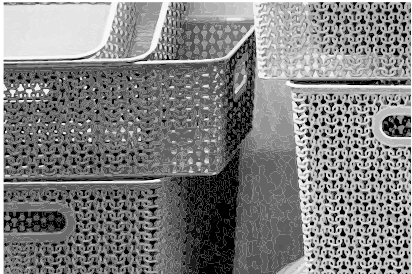

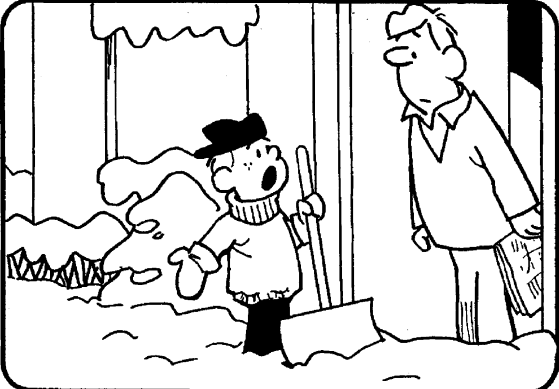

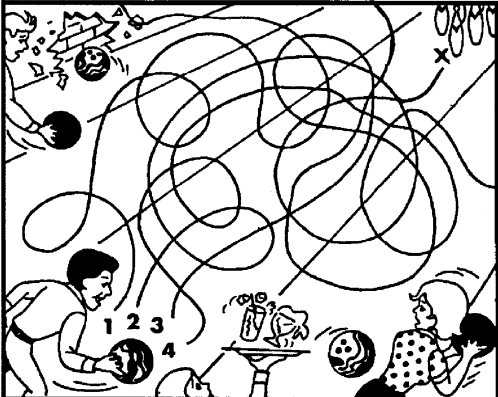

Seven (even, eve).

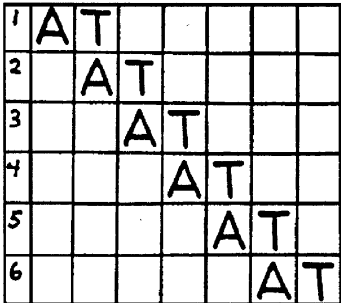

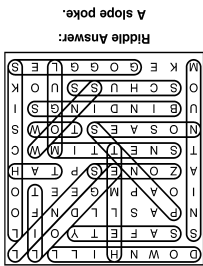

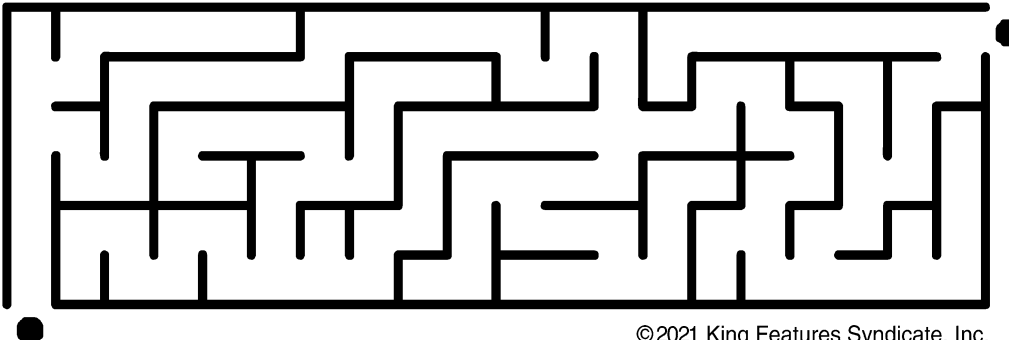
