Lane Community College approves 2021-22 tuition rates

EUGENE—The Lane Community College (LCC) Board of Education approved tuition rates for the 2021-22 academic year at its March 17 meeting, and prepared for an emergency fee in the event of insufficient state funding.

This year, resident students are paying \$126 per credit hour. That includes

\$121 in tuition plus a \$5 emergency fee that was instituted last summer due to the economic impact of the pandemic. That \$5 fee is set to be retired at the end of this academic year.

Next year, students will continue to pay \$126 per credit hour, but for tuition only, provided that the state funds Oregon's 17 com-

munity colleges at \$640.9 million or better in the 2021-23 biennium. If state funding falls below that level, then LCC will have to add another emergency fee.

The board approved a \$10 fee, contingent upon state funding.

LCC hopes to use the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund II to fully

offset further economic impact wrought by the continuing pandemic, and avoid adding any additional fees to student costs.

The new academic year begins with summer term on June 21.

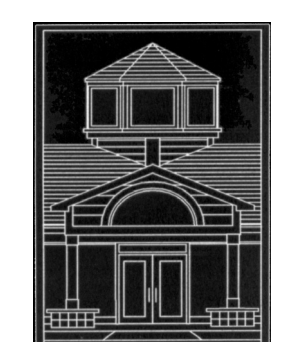

Library to Open for Browsing

The library is pleased to begin offering browsing at our facilities in Florence and Mapleton.

Browsing will begin on Thursday, April 1 — no joke!

To begin, Siuslaw Public Library will match its curbside pickup and drop-off hours, so Monday through Thursday, the hours will be from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m. and on Fridays from 11 a.m. to 6 p.m.

In Mapleton, we will offer a slightly expanded service from current curbside hours, providing browsing from noon until 5 p.m. on Thursdays only. Days open, including weekends, and the

number of hours, will increase as conditions allow.

Patrons will continue to be required to wear masks inside the library. Appointments are not necessary.

We have new touch less check-out stations we encourage patrons to use. There will be no seating at this time and meeting rooms are not available. You can bring your kids in to select books but toys are not available and we cannot accommodate play groups or meet-ups. Restrooms will also be closed to the public.

We will continue to offer curbside service for those who wish to pick up their library materials that way, though we will be moving the carts inside the library proper.
