"It's more than just the water being turned off. It's also concerning when they don't notify us when they're going to be turning the water off and the fact when they do turn the water back on ... we were never notified that we were able to drink the water again."

According to the resident, a letter was not sent out to customers informing them that it was safe to drink, with most getting word through the newspaper and on social media.

Calls to the MWD from Siuslaw New seeking clarification on the water bills sent to customers, and unconfirmed reports that sitting board members have resigned due to the latest situation, have gone unanswered and unreturned.

In addition, the resignation of Terry Saubert as MWD Board for the selection of new board President has been posted on various social media platforms but has not been officially verified, and calls to Saubert were not returned as of press time.

project have begun with preparatory work being done in advance of Hyak beginning to install and construct the extensive system, which will be needed to run fiber optics and the supporting equipment needed to monitor the system.

"We have quite a bit of work in front of us," said Wright. "We're looking at more than 80 miles of fiber to be deployed with requirements to be built out to 40 percent within three years, and 100 percent in six years. While we'd like to expedite those timelines, some of these areas are pretty remote with some challenging aspects of their build."
