DO-AS-I-DO STEPWORDS

ANIMAL PAIRS: In the diagram at right we have 14 words that we want you to pair to form seven two-syllable words of varying lengths. The words on the left provide the first syllable and the ones on the right the second syllable.

A good way to start is to take the top word at the left, find a compatible word at the right and draw a line connecting the two. Move to the second word, word, word, word, word, word, word.

Answers: (1) Two. One girl and one boy standing back to back. (2) 36. The product of its digits (3 times 6) is 18. Two times 18 equals 36.
