What do you see as the greatest impact you have made for Lane County and what is the key to your success?

Gardiepy: Over the past two years, EcoGeneration has taken in over 30,000 pounds of plastic waste in Lane County. Our biggest impact is the fact that communities and kept a variety of plastics out of our oceans and waterways while building awareness about reducing plastic

At each of our threehour events, we typically have more than 150 recyclers who take the time to sort and clean their plastics and wait in line to process their recyclables. That speaks volumes for the community members

What should the residents of

Florence know about the upcoming events and how to prepare their recyclables? Gardiepy: The main

objective of these 2021 events is to make sure we collect reusable plastic that will be accepted by the various vendors who remanufacture this plastic. People should remember three words when recycling — clean, dry and

Cleanliness is the most important. If it isn't clean, we cannot accept it.

Everything must be dry so there is no mold or slimy residues, because vendors need pure plastic without contamination.

Sorting the plastic into we have cleaned up our the different types is also very important.

People should be prepared to wait in line. It takes time to process the caps, 6 inches or smaller, various recyclables and we are a volunteer organization. Thank you in advance for your patience and understanding.
