

"I know this will bring relief to many across the state. However, the lifting of Extreme Risk health and safety measures comes with great personal responsibility for us all. If Oregonians continue to keep up their guard, follow High Risk health and safety measures, and get vaccinated as fast as possible, we should see our COVID-19 case and hospitalization rates decline.

"I'd like to thank Oregonians for taking this surge seriously for the last several weeks. It's because of you that our hospitals have not been overwhelmed.

"Today, we also received the welcome news from the Biden-Harris administration that they will be reallocating unused vaccines to the states that need them. Oregon will ask for the maximum allowed, which will help us to get shots in arms faster.

"Vaccinations are still our best path to protecting our loved ones, and staying on track to fully reopen our economy by the end of June."
