On Friday (May 7), Siuslaw's softball team traveled to Marshfield for a doubleheader. While the team continues to improve at the plate and on defense, they were unable to defeat the Pirates, losing both games 14-5 and

In game one, the Lady Viks started at the plate aggressively and, after two quick outs, Bailey Overton hit a double to get things go-

Liz Garcia-Galvan was then hit by a pitch (HBP) to advance to first base, bringing Kya Blake up to bat. Blake hit a single but made it to second after an error by the Pirates, picking up an RBI along the way by sending Overton home to score. Marshfield then struck out the Vikings' final batter, Brynlee Manues, ending their at-bat 1-0.

The Pirates set out to take control offensively straightaway and, after having their first batter walked, hit two doubles for RBIs. The next batter was tagged out at first by Blake from on an assist by Overton at short stop — but not before landing another RBI for the Pirates.

Marshfield then hit two more doubles for RBIs and had a batter walk before the Viks' next put out — which again came at first base, this time from an assist pass by Meika Shap-

pell at third base.

The next two batters hit singles, the first bringing in 2 RBIs, before the Pirates picked up their final out at third base from Shappell, ending the inning 1-6 in Marshfield's favor.

In the top of the second inning, the Vikings came out determined to swing, but were put out quickly with a caught pop fly, a tag-out at first and another strikeout for the Pirates.

Although they faced a 5-run loss in game one, the Vikings shook it off and were ready to rock in game two. First at bat, Elijah Blankenship was hit by a

pitch (HBP), but used it to his advantage, stealing second base as Jason Garcia took the plate.

Garcia hit a double, and on the next play, Blankenship went home for the Vikings' first run of the game. Two other batters were HBP that inning, but between a strikeout and two caught pop flies, the Pirates came to the plate with the Vikings in the lead, 1-0.

With Marshfield at bat, Isaac Garza struck out their first batter, but then the Pirates followed

MID-COAST LAKES:

Mid-coast lakes are full of trout and the fishing has been good. Many of the lakes have been stocked twice now and several others received stockings in mid-March. Here is a list of the lakes that have been stocked so far this year: Thissel Pond, Cleawox, Munsel, Mercer, Alder, Dune, Buck, Lost, Carter, Devils, Woahink, Elbow, Siltcoos, Eckman, and Big Creek Reservoirs #1 and #2. All of these lakes are scheduled to receive more trout stockings

in April as well. SIUSLAW RIVER: Winter

steelhead Winter steelhead fishing continues to be slow on the Siuslaw and is slowing down for the season which closed March 31. Trout fishing in streams opens on May 22. Hatchery fish are also planted in Lake Creek and are released into Green Creek. These returning hatchery fish will start to show up in December and peak in January and February. Lake Creek closed to all fishing March 31 and will open on

May 22 for trout fishing. Winter steelhead fishing continues to be slow on the Alsea. The recent rain improved the conditions and the fishing picked up a bit. Overall, it continues to be slow and the run is winding down
