In the 1500 meters, Samuel Ulrich and Chad Hughes took first and second place with times of 4:19.64a and 4:19.99a, which allows them to go to the state meet for the event as well. Ulrich won Oustanding Male Runner of the meet, and also took first in the 800 meters with a time of 2:04.83a. He will represent the Vikings at state in that event as well.

In the 400 meters, Jaxson Jensen took second with a time of 55.42a and will compete in the state event this weekend.

One of the more surprising upsets of the season was brought by Elijah Blankenship, who spent most of his time on the baseball team this season but was able to place second in the 200 meters (23.61a) and the 100 meters (11.74a), with the district meet being only the second track meet Blankenship competed in for his whole high school

"Just watching him play football, we knew he had some foot speed, but he qualified in four events," said Johnson. "We had two kids who were sick at the end of the meet and couldn't run the 4x400, and one of the last things I did before my entries were closed was to throw Elijah's name in there just in case they needed

"It's one thing to go run a 100-meter race, but running a 400 is a whole different world when you haven't done any training."

The 4x100 team took first at the meet with a 45.63a, and the 4x400 team took second with a time of 3:41.91a. Both relay teams will compete at state this weekend.
