Freeman picked up another free throw point with 42 seconds left in the quarter, and Bledsoe had one more rebound before the end of the first quarter with the Bulldogs ahead 28-6. In the second quarter

Haylee Cole, Garcia-Galvan and freshman Iriena Khufu each picked up a rebound, but the Lady Viks only scored one free throw point that quarter, also from Garcia-Galvan.

The Bulldogs continued to pull ahead, and the score

was 39-7 at the half.

Garcia-Galvan played aggressively for the remainder of the game, going hard to the basket for attempted shots and going to the line for free throws 4 more times as a result. She picked up 2 points from a layup, as well as 3 more rebounds and a steal. Perkins picked up another 2 rebounds for Siuslaw in addition.

Towards the end of the third quarter, junior Maisie Jones picked up 2 points from the top of the key, followed by another two points from sophomore Denali Sleeper just before the quarter's end, bringing the score to 42-13.

In the last quarter, Jones picked up a rebound for the

Lady Viks, and freshman Ashley Hennessee had 2. Freeman scored Siuslaw's final 2 points with 1:00 left in the game, and the final score was 43-15.


