The goal of the proposed changes is to reduce noise impacts on neighboring communities while being more realistically attainable by riders.

The proposed decibel limits will also better align with State of Oregon regulations, provide consistency across motorized riding areas throughout the Siuslaw National Forest, and will be easier to enforce.

Based on years of monitoring, the sound limit

The preliminary pro-

posal changes the decibel limit for front-engine vehicles from 93dBA to 95dBA and the limit for all other motorized vehicles from 93dBA to 97dBA. As most noise-level complaints have stemmed from vehicles registering
