Juneteenth is a celebration honoring the day when black slaves were legally freed in the United States. With the recent passage of House Bill 2168, Oregon officially recognized Juneteenth as a state holiday.

Oregon Gov. Kate Brown signed the bill on June 5.

She stated, "Now is a time for healing and justice. To reimagine a more perfect union that truly protects the rights of all. Celebrating and recognizing Juneteenth as a holiday is one step towards that. A small step. But a step we must take."

Florence Organizes (FOR) will sponsor a Juneteenth Celebration on Saturday, June 19, outside at the Florence United Methodist Church from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.

Florence City Councilor Sally Wantz will deliver a statement.

Other speakers include Siuslaw School Board Director Maureen Miltenberger, LCC Florence Dean Russ Pierson and Rev. Dr. Karen Love Baisinger from the Florence United Methodist Church.

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Sheriffs report that missing Eugene man was found

At 10 p.m. June 11, Lane County Sheriff's Office (LCSO) reported that Adam Specht was located and transported to an area hospital for evaluation.

"We would like to thank the community for support and efforts to locate him," LCSO said.

On Friday, the agency announced that Eugene-based Adam Specht, 56, had been missing since June 10. With the assistance of search and rescue volunteers, LCSO searched for Specht, as he did not return home to Eugene after telling

family members that he was going to the beach.

Specht's vehicle, along with his cell phone, were located in the North Jetty parking lot near Florence.

Area agencies, including the Florence Police Department, Siuslaw Valley Fire and Rescue and the U.S. Coast Guard assisted with the search.

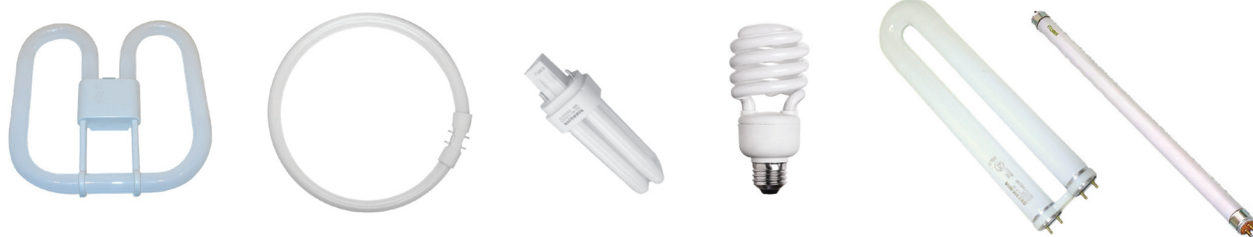

Maximum 20 Fluorescent Lamps



Maximum 35 gallons of paint measured in can size – not liquid contents



35 single gals.



4 quarts of paint = one gallon



5 single gals. = one 5 gal. container
