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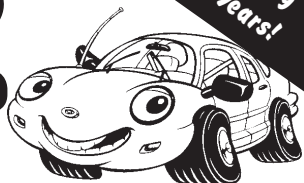

Camp Learn-a-Lot wraps up end of school year

Some first graders had the opportunity to attend Camp Learn-a-Lot at Camp Baker in June. It was all made possible by Boy Scouts of America generously renting the camp for a minimal amount, a Western Lane Community Foundation grant that awarded \$600 to pay for the rental fee, a grant from Oregon Forest Resources Institute awarding a grant to pay for the bus transportation, and Siuslaw Elementary first-grade teacher Mrs. Shannon Graham was awarded a \$500 award from WE charity.

"It was a wonderful opportunity for them after an incredibly challenging year doing distance learning," Graham said. "They got to enjoy a dose of normal, amazing, outdoor togetherness, which felt like a celebration for persevering through the most challenging school year ever."

Students had three days of hands-on forest ecology experiences. They learned plant and animal identification, the layers of the forest, decomposition, about bugs and insects, and lifecycles.

They also participated in crafts, games, and daily campfire sing-a-longs.

Students worked to earn beads for their camp necklaces with acts of kindness, showing signs of positive character traits and knowledge learned at camp.

Graham the three-day Camp Learn-a-Lot experience, and two Siuslaw School District retired teachers, Tod Graham and Tami Worley, helped teach classes during the camp.

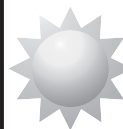
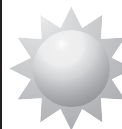
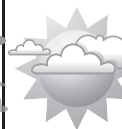
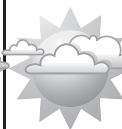
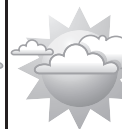
Lane County hosts Drive Thru Vaccine Clinic at SMS today
