Community College announced Wednesday that it will require all students attending on-campus classes to be vaccinated against COVID-19 when fall term begins in September. The policy move was approved by the LCC Board of Education at its July 21 meeting.

In an effort to make COVID-19 vaccines more accessible to its community, LCC will continue to offer vaccines through its Student Health Clinic. LCC is the only community college in Oregon to have an on-campus health

Many local colleges and universities have announced COVID-19 vaccination requirements for fall term, including the University of Oregon, Oregon State University and Pacific University. Other community colleges have announced vaccine requirements for athletes, students in on-campus housing, and allied health students.

Vaccinations will also be required for faculty and staff. Details of that requirement will be determined in consultation with faculty and staff unions.




