Locally, recent shortterm closures include The Hukilau, Bridgewater Fish House, Little Brown Hen Café, Novelli's Seafood and Dairy Queen. Not all of these closures are directly related to COVID, as equipment issues at the Brown Hen and Novelli's are to blame for closures at those locations, but repair times have been extended as shipping and production of components needed for repairs has been interrupted, in some instances for months.



In a statement, he wrote, "We have overcome and persevered through many obstacles since the opening of our restaurant in July 2019. The pandemic restrictions and shutdowns, the passing of our beloved employee Ryan, the chimney fire we had, the lack of employees, food ordering restrictions and the lack of provisions have all been difficult hurdles we have overcome."

The final burden came Some restaurants are also with a city-mandated need for an upgrade to the fire suppression system for the building. As tenants, the owners of Off Bay Street Bistro could not afford this improvement.

> "We have spent many hours trying to come up with ideas to solve this dilemma, unfortunately to no avail," Meeker said.

The restaurant plans to close in October.

"We are not asking for money and we don't want to set up a GoFundMe page or anything like that. We just want to inform the public, with a heavy heart, that we will be closing and we want to thank you for the support you have given us throughout the years. We appreciate you very much," Meeker said.

son's Wheelhouse officially closed on Aug. 15. The restaurant was unable to navigate the shifting mandates from the state and the available product from their food vendors, along with a shortage of staff.

There have been some winners in the restaurant shakeout, as venues with outdoor seating or larger interior spaces have been the beneficiaries of short-term




