Roads leading to the firewood cutting areas may be primitive and require 4-wheel drive. Avoid cutting, piling or gathering firewood near any stream, pond, permit cutting in specific lake, marshy or wet area, to help Siuslaw National Forest protect water quality and fish habitat.


