Siuslaw was down 10 with just over six minutes to go in the game but scored twice late to send Cascade Christian (CC), of Medford, home with their second loss of the season.

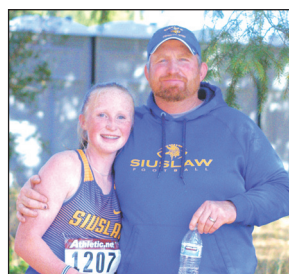
After receiving the opening kickoff, the Vikings drove the field with little resistance

from the Challenger defense, only to fumble on the CC 15-yard line. This turnover proved costly as the Challengers put together their own drive, culminating with a 7-yard touchdown run by running back Triston Wallace to go up 7-0.

On Sept. 30 both sides of Glen Butler Court were nearly full of fans of both teams and Siuslaw took care of Junction City in four sets in a Sky-Em League match.

The fans in attendance saw a great team win for the Vikings as almost every girl that played made large

contributions. Especially impressive was the play of sophomore Cate Waggoner.

Called in cold from the bench when classmate Brynlee Manues went down with an ankle injury, Waggoner performed to perfection.

Junior Desi Tupua shone and had 9 kills, 5 tips for points and 3 blocks.

“Desi has such a knack for knowing when to tip, when to go in for the kill and when to play it safe, scoring a lot of points on the board for us,” said Siuslaw Coach Kari Blake.

As is becoming the standard, junior Hailee Outlaw and freshman Mylee Blake played a great game on the outside. Outlaw had a team leading 11 kills and Mylee had 10. Freshman Rhianna Lane led the team in blocks with 6.

Senior Hayden Muller had 23 digs and 16 perfect passes from the back row.

“Hayden picked up a ton of balls that probably should’ve dropped. She was all over the floor tonight,” noticed Coach Blake.

Sophomore Meika Shappell was also solid out of the middle back. Senior setter Zoe Alberty did
