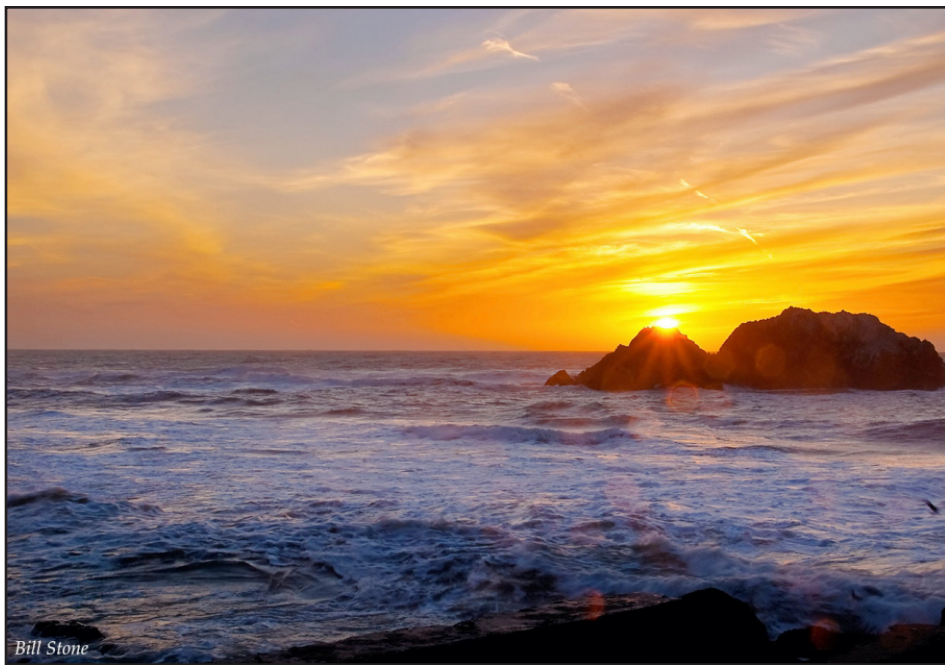

Local help is available for Medicare Open Enrollment

Every October, open enrollment begins for Medicare Advantage and Part D prescription drug plans. Medicare plans and coverage for prescription drugs change each year, so it is important for Oregonians who are enrolled in Medicare to evaluate their plan options

and make changes during open enrollment.

Open enrollment for the 2022 Medicare plan year is from Oct. 15 to Dec. 7, 2021.

The Senior Health Insurance Benefits Assistance (SHIBA) program with the Oregon Department of Human Services (ODHS) is

available to help Oregonians understand their Medicare options and benefits, provide enrollment guidance, and answer any questions related to Medicare benefits.

800-722-4134 (toll-free). To accommodate COVID-19 safety precautions, SHIBA counselors are providing telephone and limited in-person support.

Western Lane Fire/EMS holds Mapleton Town Hall

Western Lane Fire and EMS Authority (WLFEA) Chief Michael Schick, Operations Chief Matt House and Director Mike Webb will be

holding a Town Hall meeting at the Mapleton High School Gymnasium on Monday, Oct. 18, at 7 p.m.

The purpose of the Town Hall meeting is to answer questions regarding the emergency medical services that are provided to the communities of Mapleton, Swiss-home and Deadwood.

"We look forward to a great conversation and invite all residents to attend,"

Schick said.

Siuslaw Valley Fire and Rescue provides an all-hazards emergency response to 14,000 people over 98 square miles. Western Lane Ambulance District provides emergency medical service (EMS) to 17,500 people over 564 square miles. Together, the agencies include full-time, part-time and volunteer personnel that respond to an average of 3,800 calls per year.

On Oct. 1, 2019, the administrative offices of Siuslaw Valley Fire/Rescue and Western Lane Ambulance District combined to form Western Lane Fire and EMS Authority.
