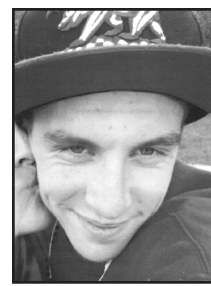

Signups open now for energy assistance

Siuslaw Outreach Services will once again hold sign-ups for the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (also known as LIHEAP) on Monday, Nov. 1 beginning at 9 a.m.

This federally funded program is designed to ease the burden of low-income household that experience rising heating bills in the winter. Funds are dispersed on a first come, first served basis.

This one-time payment toward an applicant's heating bill is based upon monthly gross income and number of household members.

To sign-up for the waitlist, applicants may stop by the Siuslaw Outreach Services office on 12th Street in Florence or call the office at 541-997-2816.

Applicants will be notified of an appointment time. At the time of the appointment, applicants will be required to provide copy of heating bill, proof of residency and proof of income.

Sign-ups will be taken until all space is filled.
