Pack on the pounds of food for local hungry

The 21st annual “Pound-ing” to benefit Florence Food Share will be held at Grocery Outlet on Saturday, Nov. 20, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. Founded and hosted by local businesswoman Cindy Wobbe, this annual food drive aims to fill the food bank’s pantries with much needed canned, boxed and frozen food items in time for the holiday season.

Started in 2000 and held the Saturday just before each Thanksgiving, the Pounding is modeled after the early tradition often practiced in small communities when a new family or preacher would move to town.

“To help folks get their feet firmly planted, every-one would join together and contribute a pound of food to fill the pantry. Someone would bring a pound of flour, another a pound of sugar and some-body else a pound of beans. When everybody chips in, we can fill those shelves pretty quickly,” said Wobbe. “Over 700 families in our community are food inse-cure and rely on food share to keep from going hungry each month. That need is not going to go away. This food drive has been a god-send year after year.”

Last year’s event raised 18,796 pounds of food, pushing the total Pound-ing donations over the last 21 years to over 165,000 pounds.

For the sixth year, Top Hydraulics has announced

that it will also match the total number of pounds do-nated.

“I’m thrilled for food share!” Wobbe said. “This corporate match means that for every pound we re-ceive, Top Hydraulics will donate an additional \$1. It’s a significant and generous gift and that will impact so many who are in need.”

In light of current COVID numbers and fol-lowing recommendations from Lane County Public Health, this year’s Pound-ing will follow the same model as last year and will be a drive-through event in front of Grocery Outlet.

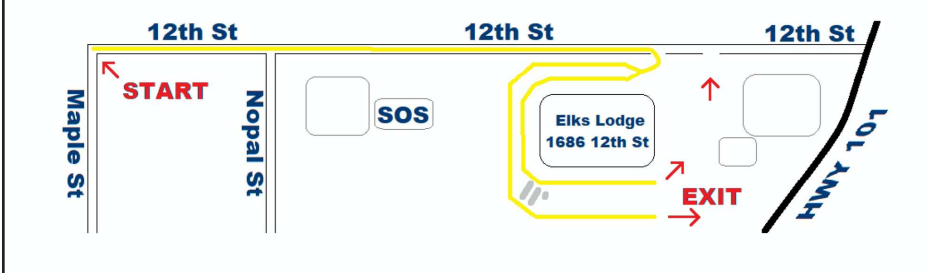
Kiwanis continues free Community Thanksgiving Dinner
