Democratic State Convention

M., for the purpose of nominating a candidate for Member of Congress, to be voted for at the Special Election, to be held October 15th, 1873, and for the transaction of any other business that may properly come before it.

Table listing delegates by county: Benton 5, Baker 5, Clackamas 7, Columbia 1, Clatsop 2, Curry 1, Coos 3, Douglas 9, Grant 3, Jackson 9, Josephine 12, Linn 12. Total 124.

It is suggested by the Committee that the several counties hold their County Conventions on the 30th day of August, 1873, where this arrangement does not suit the convenience of the Democracy of the several counties, it is expected they will make the necessary changes through their County Committees.
