PORT OF ASTORIA.

Following is a list of vessels on the way to this port, and a record of the arrivals and departures up to date:

British bark Vesta, from Liverpool, to Janion & Rhodes—12 days out August 12. British bark Sylhet, Liverpool, via Victoria, to Janion & Rhodes—43 days out August 12. Am. ship Loretta Fish from Shields via Callao—154 days out August 12.

In the Port and Rivers.

American ship Ctogo, in ballast from Victoria, to load with wheat for Liverpool, arrived 21st. British ship Privateer in ballast from Mexico to load wheat for Europe, arrived 31st.

Clearances and Departures.

Schooner Superior from San Francisco, sailed August 24th, arrived August 24th. Left Knapp-ton on return voyage Sept. 4th. Barkentine Webfoot, Gage, sailed from Knapp-ton W. T. Sept. 4th for San Francisco, loaded with lumber.
