## Yellow Fever in Shreveport.

Sr. Louis, September 17.

Yellow fever in Shreveport, Louisiana, is terrible and continued unabated on the 15th, and the weather was unfavorable. Sixty per cent of those attacked die. There is great suffering in all classes of society for want of proper nursing. Citizens are doing all in their power to check the disease. Interments on that day numbered twenty-two. The Howard Association is greatly in need of assistance. A dispatch from Memphis, Tennessee says: The wildest rumors prevailed with regard to the yellow fever. Trains leaving on various roads were crowded with persons fleeing from the scourge. Lord C. Baker, Superintendent of the Western Union Telegraph Company sends the following.

"To the Agent of the Associated Press: The latest advices from Shreveport represent the yellow fever as unabated, and the distress in the city indiscribable. Of six men in our telegraph office, five have taken the fever and two have died. Interments average 30 to 40 daily, in a population perhaps of not over 4,000. All the physicians and nurses are worked down. The people of the country should know these terrible facts and send aid to this suffering
