PORT OF ASTORIA.

Following is a list of vessels on the way to this port, and a record of the arrivals and departures up to date: Bark Whistler, Simpson, from Bolivia. Bark Cutwater, sailed from S. F., 31st. Brig Orient, sailed from S. F., Oct. 27th. Star Ajax, Dolles, from San Francisco. British bark Arouce, 602 tons, from Peru. Brig Sheet Anchor, sailed from S. F., 31st. Sch Alice Huake, sailed from S. F., Oct. 29. Barkentine Webfoot, sailed from S. F., 27th. Star Idaho, with cargo from San Francisco. Sch Superior, sailed from San Francisco Oct. 29th. Prof. Airy, 419 tons, from South America. Island Belle, 315 tons, from South America. City of Lima, 315 tons, from South America. British bark Aliva, from Callao, Sept. 29. Ship Sagamore, from Rio Janeiro, Sept. 19. British ship Ellen Goudy, from Callao, Sept. 27th. British bark Admiral Fitzroy, from Buenos Ayres, Sept. 18. British ship Andromeda, from Melbourne, via San Francisco, August 14th. Nor bark Gungner, 655 tons from Rio Janeiro via Victoria. Bk Lovett Peacock, sailed from San Francisco October 20th. Am. ship Loretta Fish from Shields via Callao—154 days out August 12. Nor bk Navigator, Samsonsen, 500 tons, from Rio Janeiro—31 days out Oct. 2nd. British bark Sylhet, Liverpool, via Victoria, to Janion & Rhodes—31 days out August 12. French ship Moscow, Marineau, 925 tons—possibly 60 days out Oct. 20th, from La Union. We hear of several vessels on the way here aggregating 34,000 tons, already chartered and for charter, to arrive, among them the British bark Loyal Sam, and Norwegian bark Electra, from Rio Janeiro.
