CLEARANCES AND DEPARTURES.

No vessels have passed out since our last report. CLEARANCE. Nov. 6th, British ship City of Paris, McDonald, 29,370 cents wheat, valued at \$58,738, for Queenstown, Ireland. Of this amount 14,150 cents were taken on at Astoria, and 15,211 cents at Portland. Nov. 6th, British ship Lord of the Isles, Craigie, 21,055 cents wheat, valued at \$42,100, for Liverpool. Of this amount 3,800 cents were taken on at Astoria, and 17,255 cents at Portland.
