## The Price of Gold.

PORTLAND, Dec. 8.—Gold in New York to-day, 109½; Portland Legal Tender rates,—90½ buying, and 91½ selling.

—Nine vessels from Coos bay arrived at San Francisco in one day. The schooner Hera from Astoria, arrived the same day.

—Western men have concluded hereafter to be more careful in committing their interests to the care of Wall street financiers.

—The Italian government has purchased from Madamae Rattazzi the papers left by her late husband, in order to prevent their publication.

—When a legislator goes to his home with an agency to act for some Railroad or other corporation, people are quizzical—and want to know whys and wherefores just as if it was their business.

—There are only \$295,000 asked for by the Secretary of War to complete the fortifications about San Francisco; or, to speak more correctly, that is the amount which he deems it expedient to expend on them during the next year.

—The timber cut and removed under a permit issued by authority of the agent of the Northern Pacific Railroad Company, will bring the question before the Courts as to the right of the Railroad Company to sell timber from Government lands.

—The Sacramento Union, in anticipation of the pressure which will be brought to bear upon members of the Legislature, suggests that Farmers' Granges, and other interests, shall send representatives to Sacramento to assist in securing beneficial legislation, as well as the election of a United States Senator.

—The new Postoffice at New York, for the construction of which the Government has appropriated \$7,500,000, will be ready for the occupants by the 4th of July. No wood is to be used in its construction; granite, iron and brick, being the principal materials; 14,000,000 brick have already been used in it.

—Great results in the way of revenue to Chili are expected from the discovery of a vast deposit of guano, extending for miles in a plain which terminates at the foot of a range of hills, about forty miles from Antofagasta. It is covered by a crystalline crust, which has to be broken through.

—Germany has finally decided on practically testing the proposition of abolishing telegraph poles by burying all the wires in the earth. Tubes are to be laid in shallow trenches, and through these wires are to run. If the project proves a successful one it will, no doubt, meet with a universal adoption.
