This vessel loaded at Portland, but too deeply to get out, and a portion of her cargo had to be lightered over the shoals at the cost of two days' demurrage which the ship refused to pay the lighter, and which was not settled yesterday, for want of telegraphic communication with consignees. Jan. 5, British bark Arauco, for Cork, with 19,655 cents—\$39,300. Jan. 5, British bark Sidlaw, for Queenstown, 16,154 cents—\$32,300. Jan. 10th, Bark Windward, for Shanghai, with a cargo of Salmon and lumber, valued at \$1,921, taken on board as follows: at Portland, to the value of \$1,251; at Astoria, \$670. Jan. 13, Bktn Jane A. Falkinburg, Brown, for Honolulu, with domestic produce, taken at Astoria to the value of \$1,221, at Portland, \$3,127.
