Oil—Alaska Cod Liver Oil, 90c; Dog Fish Liver Oil, 65c; Shark do, 65c; Tanner's Oil, 18c.

Wool—Scales for the week about 1,000,000 lbs. There has been a very active demand all the week, so that now the market is swept nearly bare of all excepting Oregon and some Northern Wools.

Potatoes—\$1 65 @ 2 50 per cental. Onions—40 @ 55 cts per cental. Mill Feed—\$22 per ton; Middlings \$24.

Case Goods—Salmon—One lb tins are quotable at \$1 70 @ 1 75 for export, 2-lb tins and 2 1/2-lb tins \$3 00 @ 3 25 for the former and \$3 50 for the latter, according to brand; bbls and half bbls, \$9 00 @ 10 00 for former and \$4 50 @ 5 50 for latter.
