The Sunday Law.

Having been asked repeatedly what the existing laws were in regard to the profanation of Sunday, we give the statue as it now reads in the "General Laws of Oregon." Sec. 653, chapter xlix, "Crimes Against Public Policy," reads as follows:

Section 653. If any person shall keep open any store, shop, grocery, ball-alley, billiard room, tippling house or any place of amusement, or shall do any secular business or labor, other than works of necessity or mercy, on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, or the Lord's day, such person, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by fine not less than five, nor more than fifty dollars. The following are deemed works of nocessity:

1. The buying and selling of meats, fish and milk at retail, before nine o'clock in the morning. 2. The buying and selling drugs and

medicine at retail or upon prescrip-3. The selling of food, to be eaten

on the premises where sold; and 4. The keeping open of barber shops and laboring at such trade until ten o'clock in the morning.
