NOTICE TO SHIP MASTERS.

The undersigned respectfully desires to inform Masters of vessels entering the port of Astoria that there actually exist such as real live stevedores right here at Astoria, without their being obliged to travel a hundred miles up the river to find one, and in the end be compelled to take the man particularly pointed out to them by the Portland ring whether agreeable to the Captain or not, take him he must. I remarked they were compelled to take the man pointed out to them and I repeat it; for the stevedores once in the sanctum of the Portland ring has no choice but patiently to submit to the one man concern.
It is a well known fact that stevedore bills constitute one of the principal items of ship bills in all commercial ports; but under the present systematic arrangements of the Portland ring managers, the Captains opinion on that subject, there is never called into question or consulted, every precaution being studiously taken, and every avenue to approach the Captain on that subject by outsiders, being jealously guarded by the totem and wire-pullers of the ring leaves no alternatives, but, for the Captain's submission to accept the conditions held out by them.
But I will here take the liberty to state, for the special benefit of ship Masters, and I am able to prove my assertion, that I can save to any ship Captain or owner the round sum of three hundred and four dollars in U. S. gold coin, on every 1,000 tons of wheat or flour that may go into their ships here at Astoria, and if ship Masters choose to accept my proposition, I'll guarantee the best satisfaction at figures proportionally nominal compared to Portland rates.
Under the present system of employing stevedores at Portland the Master of a ship is completely at the mercy of the consignee agent or quarter-party, who makes it their business to point out their man Jack, and the Captain is obliged to consent to accept the conditions held out by them, the utmost care being taken and tender solicitude exhibited towards the Captain, in order to guard and protect him from all danger of approach or contact with outside parties, for fear of opposition, as from an epidemic, he is given for a moment lost sight of by the totem and wire-pullers of the ring, from the moment he sets foot on terra firma, until he's got his clearance in his pocket and on his way.
But three hundred and four dollars on every 1,000 tons can be deducted from any ships expenses in the port of Astoria by my system of stevedoring, which otherwise goes into the capacious pockets of the so-called Portland boss-rigger and stevedore. But I'll show the proposition your patience a good venture to realize, and I'll back my claims at any time or place, that neither of the parties denouncing themselves riggers, and taking themselves out as such, possess the ability to even rig a plunger or cut a foot rope, for a royal yard, far less rig a ship. I make this assertion because I am positive of which way of work, has been both in ports of the Atlantic states, on the Pacific coast and for a matter of ten years on the Columbia river, carried in stevedoring myself, and consequently a pretty well posted as to the abilities of most men in that particular branch of business around here, having had ample opportunities to test them all; the parties referred to may be able to cross top-gallant yards with pipe-stems, but never did they ever will know how to cut a set of rigging for, or rig a ship.
As regards the loading of ships, I can here save, by state, and defy any one to contradict it, that after deducting the labor bill from the total total against every 1,000 tons at Portland rates and charges; three hundred and four dollars pass into the hand of the boss-rigger and stevedore as consideration for the use of his sculls, ten dollars worth of lumber, which may be brought into requisition for RIF ships, without deducting a cent of their original value. Three hundred and four dollars for every twenty hours work or use of their sculls to make some sacks on, is pretty good interest on ten dollars of capital invested, why, it knocks spots off all your romancers claims and stock-brokers speculations in America.
But what surprises you most is how ship Captains will permit themselves to be bamboozled and deceived by a set of only toughened steamboat lumberjacks rather than deal with square timber of foot men. I can prove my ability and competence at being thoroughly conversant with the business I refer to, and prepared to prove to any ship Captain how and in what manner I can reduce these stevedore bills to the amount of the above mentioned figures, and load their ships with equal dispatch, promptness and precision as any Portland stevedore, provided Captains choose to consent me on the subject.
