NOTICE TO SHIP MASTERS.

The undersigned respectfully desires to inform
masters of vessels entering the port of Astoria
that there actually exist such as real live stev-
ers right here at Astoria, without their being
obliged to travel a hundred miles up the river to
find one, and in the end be compelled to take the
man particularly pointed out to them by the Port-
land ring, whether agreeable to the Captain or not,
take him he must. I remarked they were com-
pelled to take the man pointed out to them and I
repeat it; for, the shipmasters once in the sanc-
tuary of the England ring have no choice but pa-
tiently to submit to the one man concern.
It is a well known fact that stevedores will con-
stitute one of the principal items of ships bills in
all commercial ports; but under the present sys-
tematic arrangements of the Portland ring man-
agers, the Captains opinion on that subject, there,
is never taken into consideration or consulted, every-
thing being studiously taken, and every
man the Captain on that subject
being religiously guarded by the toilers
of the ring, leaving no alternative
but for the Captain to submit to the man
pointed out by them.
I take the liberty to state, for the
benefit of ship Masters, and I am able to
state, that I can save to any ship
the round sum of three hun-
dred dollars in U. S. gold coin, on every
trip, at or four that may go into their
port, and if ship Masters choose to
consult me, I will guarantee the best rates
proportionally nominal com-
modities.
The present system of employing stev-
ers and the Master of a ship is com-
monly of the consignee agent or
who makes it their business to
manipulate the round sum of three hun-
dred dollars in U. S. gold coin, on every
trip, at or four that may go into their
port, and if ship Masters choose to
consult me, I will guarantee the best rates
proportionally nominal com-
modities.

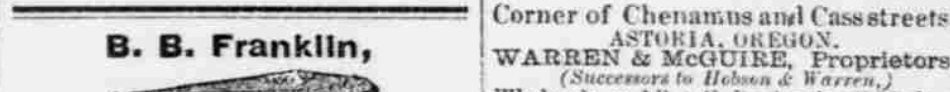
