THE CHEYENNE INDIAN TROUBLES.

LIST OF THE BRAVE BOYS KILLED.

ANOTHER INVESTIGATION TALKED OF.

A BAD PIECE OF BUSINESS.

LONG CABINET SESSION.

THE PENSION BILL, INDIAN AFFAIRS, AND SITTING BULL.

LUTTRELL NOT SATISFIED WITH THE OREGON MILITARY ROAD JOB.

PROPOSES TO PLAY HOB WITH PATENTS TO OTHER LANDS ON THIS COAST.

THE RUSSIAN PLAGUE TO BE INVESTIGATED.

FORT ROBINSON, Jan. 24.—Capt. Wessell's command arrived in camp this afternoon bringing the dead bodies of Sergeant Taggart, Privates Brown, Nelson and Debloise, the latter having died on the road; also the wounded, and seven Cheyenne prisoners, one buck and one squaw died before reaching here. The board meets at this post to-morrow to make an investigation into the whole affair. The Indians now here are under guard and will be taken to Fort Leavenworth. Private Hantz, Co. H; 3d cavalry, who was wounded the day after the outbreak, died in the hospital to-day.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 24.—The cabinet session to-day was the longest in duration that has been held for years. All members were present. There was considerable discussion of the pension bill. Indian affairs and Sitting Bull was also much discussed.

Luttrell's Pulgas ranch bill came up again in the house to-day. It was vigorously opposed by Horace Davis, who said its passage would unsettle all real estate titles on the Pacific coast, as it was an attempt to destroy the patent issued 22 years ago and overthrow the title which had been nine times favorably adjudicated. Luttrell supported the bill. The bill comes up again next Friday.

VIENNA, Jan. 24.—The German and Austrian delegates propose to dispatch doctors to infected districts in Russia to study the character, progress and local extension of the plague and a quarantine. The Austrian government intends introducing a bill in the reichsrath for meeting the expenses of precautionary measures against the plague.
