IMMENSE FLOODS REPORTED IN CONNECTICUT AND PENNSYLVANIA.

COW-STABLES QUARANTINED IN LONG ISLAND.

INDIAN DIFFICULTY IN WYOMING.—A HUNTERS CAMP RAIDED.

NORWICH, Feb. 13.—Ice in the She-tucket and Yantic rivers broke to-day. Both streams overflowed their banks, inundating the country. Tracks of the New London Northern railroad were buried for a time under huge cakes of ice. The wharves and cellars of this city are flooded.

PHILADELPHIA, Feb. 13.—The Schuylkill river rose rapidly last night and to-day work was suspended in the mills at Manayunk. The interior reports freshets and some alarm.

NEW YORK, Feb. 13.—Extensive cow stables at Blissville, L. I., where pleuro pneumonia exists are strictly quarantined by order of Gov. Robinson. The milk from these and other distillery fed cows is destroyed by health officers wherever found. Some venders were fined to-day in the police courts.

DEADWOOD, Feb. 13.—Last Monday a band of 25 Indians raided the camp of three hunters on the Cheyenne river, 30 miles east of Rapid City, and captured one gun, one horse and all their provisions and blankets. The hunters say that the Indians had a band of 100 horses and were moving northward.

INCREASE OF THE PLAGUE AT ZARITAZEN.

THE ENGLISH CABINET TO REPAIR AND WIPE OUT THE RECENT DISASTER IN SOUTH AFRICA.

REVOLUTION IN HAYTI.

ST. PETERSBURG, Feb. 12.—Since the thaw set in the number of plague-stricken at Zaritazen has increased. Prof. Jacobi, head of the medical commission sent into the infected district, has been attacked with the disease and was worse at last accounts.

LONDON, Feb. 13.—Northcote, chancellor of the exchequer, in the house this afternoon said that it was not desirable to exaggerate or depreciate unduly the severe blow in South Africa. There exists general admiration for the gallantry of the troops and universal sympathy for the sufferers. The cabinet has resolved to repair and wipe out the disaster.

KINGSTON, Jamaica, Feb. 12.—A revolution has broken out in Hayti. A negro disturbance of an alarming character occurred in the island of St. Vincent.

EARTHQUAKE IN CALIFORNIA.

COLTON, Cal., Feb. 13.—A sharp shock of earthquake was felt here at about 3 o'clock this morning.

—Of seventeen samples of table syrups recently examined by R. Keddal, professor of chemistry in the Michigan State Agricultural college, fifteen proved to be made from glucose, one sample contained 141 grains of oil of vitrol and 734 grains of lime to the gallon, and another, which had caused serious sickness to an entire family whom he knew, contained 72 grains of oil of vitrol, 28 of cop-peras, and 363 of lime to the gallon.

—The telegraph informs us that Gen. Grant has arrived at Bombay. In the estimation of American ship-masters, Mr. B. F. Farnam, the American consul at Bombay, is the whitest American consul in the service. He is said to be an honest official and a most worthy gentleman.
