### Pacific Coast Dispatches.

-The dispatches announce that the Alaska sailed from San Francisco last Saturday for the north. She carries ten 9-inch Dablgren guns, one 8-inch rifle, converted from an 11-ioch smooth bore, one 60-pounder rifle, with Gattling guns as howitzers. She is manned by 300 men and is a fast sailer, both under sail and steam. The vessel is almost new, having gone into commission last Septembe; and it is thought she will be amply able to cope with the difficul'y.
