A New Industry.

Thursday evening a new and rakish-looking craft, the Emily Stephens, arrived in our harbor from Westport, towed by the tug Rip Van Winkle. The dimensions of this vessel are as follows: length, 87 feet over all; beam 21 feet 10 inches; depth of hold, 8 feet. She was built for the halibut fishery and has ten compartments, or ice chests, in her hold, in which to pack and preserve fish.
