TELEGRAPHIC NEWS.

Pacific Coast Dispatches.

—A. Roman & Co., publishers and booksellers, have made an assignment to their creditors. A statement of their affairs not yet made public.

—Jos. L. King & Co., stockbrokers have failed. They resign as a cause, having too much Sierra Nevada and Union stock when the break occurred.

There was a scene in the city criminal court at San Francisco on Saturday, during the trial of Dr. W. F. Smith adultery case. Neilson a prominent witness, stated that Mrs. Tom Fitch had been trying to suborn the jury. Tom Fitch cried out: "That's a lie." Geo. W. Tyler, attorney for the prosecution, replied: "I can prove it." Fitch called him another liar, and after exchanging pet names for a few moments the silver-tongued orator broke a cane over Tyler's head. Tyler closed on his antagonist, throttled him and won first fall, when the fight was stopped before any serious damage was done. This afternoon both belligerents will have an opportunity to show cause why they should not be punished for contempt.

Eastern States.

—The Union Greenback labor convention have nominated for governor, Samuel Hill; for lieutenant governor, David A. McKay, in Providence.

—The Tremont house was burned early Saturday morning, in Claremont, N. H., and five persons perished in the flames. Others were severely injured by leaping from the windows.

—The Hudson river is nearly open at Albany. It is announced that navigation will be resumed on Monday. Steamboat and forwarding interests are unusually active and a busy season is expected.

—Horatio Seymour, in spite of his repeated refusal to accept office, is to-day the most prominent candidate for governor of the state of New York. Circumstances have conspired recently to bring his name before the people, and when that name is mentioned it awakes enthusiasm which no other arouses.

LONDON, March 29.—Queen Victoria is at Lake Maggiore.

ROME, March 29.—The final appeal of Passanante, who attempted to shoot King Humbert, has been rejected.

—Four men have been arrested at Santiago de Cuba for endeavoring to excite rebellion, and will be sent to Spain. Captain General Blanco is on his way here.

SAN FRANCISCO, March 29.—A Tucson dispatch says: Governor Mariscal and others with a small escort, have gone to Chihuahua Ures is occupied by General Carlo with 500 men. Serena is in possession of Oermosillo. The war is over. The people who came from Sonora here to avoid the revolution are returning.
