Wells, first was being escorted from the Utah penitentiary to the city by thousands of the faithful, who had been summoned from all sections of the territory to manifest their displeasure at Wells' incarceration for contempt of court.

There were between 600 and 700 men, women and children in line, on foot, on horseback and in wagons, while the sidewalks were crowded with spectators.
