The Grant Excursion.

WASHINGTON, May 20.—Plans for the excursion to meet General Grant at San Francisco are about matured, and J. B. McMillan will issue from his headquarters at the St. Nicholas hotel, New York, a formal announcement. The fare from New York to San Francisco and return will be \$150, and from Chicago and return \$125. Tickets are good for sixty days.
