TELEGRAPHIC.

THE LATEST NEWS.

—Severe shocks of earthquake occurred throughout Costa Rica May 29th and 30th. In San Jose the cathedral was partially destroyed. Slight shocks were felt on the Isthmus of Panama.

—At the solicitation of French merchants in Cochín China, the governor of the colony has obtained from the home government authorization to allow the Paris mint to coin a trade dollar for circulation in the far east. It will be exactly of the same weight and fineness as the American trade dollar.

—The exportation of Argentine wheat to Europe is assuming fabulous proportions. Twenty-five years ago the principal exports were hides. A few years afterwards wool, and now the exportation of wheat has taken the lead. This is proof that the country is progressing and growing richer day by day.

—Great Britain is evidently meditating the somewhat extensive project of partially civilizing Africa. Since no other power appears eager to make the attempt, her experiment is worthy of tacit encouragement. Without doubt many portions of central and southern Africa are as capable of supporting civilized populations as South America is.

—The Herald's London special says that the Rev. Mr. Talmage preached at Islington Presbyterian church to an enormous congregation on Sunday. Much curiosity was evinced by the people to see the famous American preacher. Half a mile before the Presbyterian church was reached, the carriage of the reverend gentleman was lifted from the ground and carried bodily to the church. It was one of the most tremendous ovations ever paid to an American Minister in London, and beats Beecher in Canada, or even Grant, in Oriental ovations.

—On Saturday last, in Salt Lake city, Emeline Young McIntosh, daughter of Brigham Young, filed a complaint against the executors of the estate of her father, alleging that they have swindled the heirs out of about \$1,200,000 by undervaluing the property and appropriating it to their own use. An injunction has been granted, and receivers have been appointed, pending the suit. George Reynolds, the convicted polygamist, is now in the hands of the United States Marshal, en route to Lincoln, Neb., to serve his term in the penitentiary.

—It is now fully timethat, as the best thing that the Canadian parliament can do, for the credit and harmony of the Dominion, to pass a complete resolution declaring that the agreement with British Columbia for the construction of Canadian Pacific railroad was entered into foolishly, and, that, in justice to itself, the Confederation must beg that all parties shall be released from the obligations connected with it. The continent does not offer a good transcontinental route for a railroad north of latitude 49°, and even if it did, the Northern Pa-

cific has such advantages that it would surely tap and drain away much of the business of its snow-bound rivals.

The Manzanita Launched.

W. E. Woodhall & Co. launched, on May 27th, at Baltimore, Md., the United States steamer Manzanita intended for light-house services on the coast of Oregon. She is schooner-rigged, 152 feet long, with 26 feet breadth of beam and 11 feet depth of hold, 542 tons, with screw propeller, and is built of white oak, cedar and pine. The propelling power will be a pair of direct acting compound engines, cylinders 34 inches in diameter, stroke of piston 36 inches. It is expected to have her ready for service by the first of August.
