#### Vacant Lands and Ditches-

I Written for THE ASTORIAN. When traveling over Clatsop plains, I ascertained from reliable settlers there, that there are large lands lying all along and cast of the sixteen miles, or to the high lands south of the fine lands upon Youngs bay, Lewis and Clark and mostly hilly or valley, well watered, exceedingly rich and fertile, healthy and capable of affording the very best of homes to industrious persons. Taking them all together they are far superior to the lands or old Pennsylvania, Virginia, and New York in their first settlements. Everywhere on these lands, as well as near the plains, whenever the land is burnt or cleared up, the wild grass, and often wild white clover, mats the land all over. On the tops of the highest hills the soil is deep, black, porous and mellow.

The undergrouth is all alike every where, elder, salmon berry, alder, vine and frequently soft maple, is covered with cedar, spruce hem- and not harm. lock, yellow fir and large alder. The country beyond the falls of Youngs river is more open and easier to clear, very rich and well watered. But the gem of the whole is an unsurveyed valley and slope of the hills, on Nekan cum Ohio idea. river, which rises near Saddle mountain, and is about fifty yards wide before it broadens out at its confluence with the ocean not far north of Tillamook head.
