## Latest from Chio.

Cino, April 12th .- A violent shock of earthquake, lasting four seconds and increasing gradually in strength, passed over the island to-day, followed by falling houses on all sides.

CONSTANTINOPLE, April 12th .-Earthquake shocks of considerable violence continue in Chio. Barely twenty houses remain habitable in the whole island. Forty-five villages are destroyed and the population in many localities has absolutely disappeared.

Chio, April 12 .-- I have now visited or obtained information regarding nearly all villages in the southern half of the island, and I believe that the number killed in all the villages in question does not much exceed one thousand and perhaps less.





The City Assessor shall nake and retarm the age-sment of all property subject to taxition by the city property certified to the Auditor on or before the 1st day of May of each year. SEC.2. Upon the filling of the assess-ment roll the Auditor shall give notice by multication in some measurements. y publication in the messpaper pub-ished in the city, that the same is open for inspection and will remain open until the test day of May following prior to which time all applications to all applications to est for the conditor e Comm be filed CITOPS HURST Size Any person doeming himself aggreered by the sseesment, valuation or listing of his property by the Assessor may apply to the Common Council for a revision of the same. Such application must be in writing and shall contain a list of all moments subject to available must be in writing and shall contain a list of all property subject to triation for city purposes, owned, by in the hands of or under the control of the ap-plicant, and a concise statement of the particular item or items channed to be erroneously assessed, which application shall be vertical by the applicant and must be filed with the Anditor on or be-fore the 15th day of May following the filing of the assessment roll. SEC.4. The assessment roll and all applications for correction thereof shall be by the Common Council referred to the committee on ways and mears, who
