- The barkentine Webfoot was taken to sea by the tug Astoria towing, Malcolma pilot.

- The Coloma arrived yesterday under sail, Herrett pilot, and proceeded up the river under sail, Ferchen pilot.
- The Coloma has 300 passengers from Hongkong. She made the run in forty seven days—the Bessie's time of last year.
- Excitement run high in San Francisco over the delay of the steamer State of California—and so did insurance, 25 to 75 per cent.
- The steamer California, Capt. Carrell, will probably arrive to-day from Sitka. She left Sitka on the 11th, and arrived at port Townsend on the 19th.
- Walla-walla streets are so bad that horses will have to be employed to draw the steam fire engine in case of fire, at an expense of \$1,200 per annum, to be raised by private subscriptions.

- Another one of those fishes that burrow in the sands at high tide to spawn, was brought to the city yesterday by Capt. Munson, and will be prepared for transmission to Prof. Baird at the Smithsonian institute, Washington.
- The fire alarm yesterday was occasioned by sparks catching on the roof of Frank Fabers ice cream saloon, and burning through the front. The alarm drew the entire department out, but a few buckets full of water squelched the flames. Damages slight.
- The Steamer Gen. Canby got caught at low tide in Bakers bay yesterday, and could not get out in time to complete her trip. The tug Mary Taylor made her afternoon trip for her. When the extension is made to the Ilwaco dock such incidents will not be heard of.
- Mr. Fred Gare, manager at Hills varieties, is in receipt of a letter from The Dalles announcing the death of John Coyne. He was killed by being run over by a train on the railway. His mother, Mrs. O'Brien, lives in Portland, and his wife, Fanny Coyne, lives in Astoria. Johnny was a minor performer, well known here.
- The Standard charges that Route Agent Skinner was detected "tearing open a bundle of Standards in order to get a copy for his personal use. A man with so little respect for the sacred nature of the United States mail ought to be put on the retired list—without a pension." When he tore open one of our bundles (prepaid with stamps), it was for the purpose of making a false report against the Astoria postmaster.
