The British bark Doon, from Bristol on April 24, for Astoria and Portland, was thrown on her beam-ends on April 5th, latitude 22° south, longitude 160 east, by a heavy sea which struck her, and the masts had to be cut away before she righted. Jury masts were rigged, and she put back, and arrived at Seaside on April 14th.
