Street Improvement Notice.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT the Common Council of the City of Astoria, Clatsop County, Oregon, did on the 15th day of June, 1881, adopt a resolution declaring the intention of the City of Astoria, to repair that portion of West-sixth street in Shively's Addition, lying between West Sixth and West Eighth Streets, and the removal of all defective pipe, caps, strungers or other timber and substituting therfor new and sound pipes, caps, strungers or other timber and substituting therfor new and sound timber and the removal of said portion of said street and by the removal of all defective iron plank lining, and the removal of all iron and wood and sound plank not less than three inches in thickness. All of said improvements to be made at the expense of the adjacent property owners, and the same to be paid unless a remonstrance signed by the owners of two-thirds of the property, fronting on said portion of said street be filed with the Astoria City Council before the 1st day of July. The final publication of this notice the Common Council will order said improvements to be made.
