New Iron Steamers.

An iron steamship is in course of construction at the east, to be known as the Queen of the Pacific. She will ply between San Francisco, Astoria and Portland. A new iron screw steamer of 3,500 tons, to be known as the Peter de Coninck, was launched at Lint-house, June 11th, by Alexander Stephen & Sons, and is intended for the trade between Antwerp and New York. She has large accommodations for emigrants and cattle. The Barrow ship building company launched the City of Rome at Barrow-in-Furness on the 14th ult. With the exception of the Great Eastern, this is the largest steamship afloat. She was built for the Inman line, and will run between Liverpool and New York. Her dimensions are: Length, 586 feet; breadth, 52 feet 3 inches; depth of hold, 37 feet, with a tonnage of 8,826 tons; her horse power indicated is 10,000. The vessel is to be rigged with four masts. Her shell plating is arranged on the principle that has been applied with great success to large trans-Atlantic steamers built at Barrow-in-Furness; the inside plates form a complete skin. To propel the ship at the high speed of eighteen knots an hour, the builders have adhered to the single screw arrangement, and adopted a propeller twenty-four feet in diameter. Steam is supplied by eight cylindrical tubular boilers, fired from both ends. The engines are intended to work constantly at 8,000 indicated horse power, although they will be capable of developing 10,000 horse power indicated. Her displacement at twenty-six feet mean draft is 13,500 tons, and the cubical contents of the hold give measurement capacity at 7,720 tons.

Andrew Sturgis is on trial in the Circuit-court at Portland for fishing for salmon on Sunday in violation of supposed law. If he is "not guilty" as charged, then the seasons fishing need not close on the 31st inst., but may continue so long as there is a fish in the river annually, which will not be many years; without propagation, or other efforts to preserve the goose that lays the golden egg.

The French academy is at loggerheads over a fund of 10,000 francs bequeathed by Mme. Botta, an American lady, of which the interest is to be awarded at stated times as a prize for the best treatise on the Condition of Woman. The time for making the first award of this prize has now arrived, but Alexandre Dumas and Emile Ollivier got into a heated discussion over the question to whom it ought to be given. Dumas favors Leon Richer, a woman's rights advocate, for his book, entitled La Femme Libre, but Ollivier is bitterly opposed to the woman's rights movement. The academy adjourned without coming to any conclusion.

All members of the Kinney family have disposed of their interests in the Salem flouring mills, except Mr. M. J. Kinney of this city. The following are the names of the new stock holders: William Scott of Liverpool, Ladd & Tilton, bankers, William Reid, banker, Portland, Ladd & Bush, bankers, Salem, George Beattie, flour miller, Salem, W. S. Sibson, merchant, Portland, Robert Bell, cashier Oregon and Washington Mortgage bank, and William Dunbar, produce merchant, Portland, William Lanson and P. M. Cochran, merchants of Dundee, Scotland, directors of the Oregon and Washington Mortgage Savings bank, are also large stockholders.

THE NEWS.

No choice at Albany yet. Mr. Conkling is in the race to stay. J. W. Brookwalter has been nominated for governor by the democracy of Ohio.

Wisconsin has enough green-backers left to make a nomination at Watertown on the 13th.

Gould's reported road to the Pacific coast from Granger, via Baker city, does not disturb Mr. Villards' dreams very much.

Hon. John H. Mitchell has been appointed attorney for the Northern Pacific railway company. His office will probably be in New York city.

Raccoon river continues to rise, and Des Moines is under water, and sixty families are out of their houses. Heaviest rain storm in the history of Iowa.

Five fatal sun strokes at Memphis on the 13th. Twenty-seven in Cincinnati; a few in St. Louis. Water is used at Cincinnati in excess of the pumps. Fifty million gallons was used on Wednesday.

Hon. J. N. Dolph is made Vice-President in the Oregon Railway and Navigation company. Mr. C. H. Prescott is manager; J. M. Buckley, assistant manager; C. J. Smith comptroller. Mr. Buckley will continue as superintendent of the railway division until August 1st.

Four men rode quietly into Riverton, Iowa, and made their way to the bank of Davis & Sons. While one of the parties engaged the attention of the cashier the others leaped the counter, took \$4,000 and invited the crowd to follow as they rode away. A large company is in pursuit.

Half a million pounds sterling an acre is "a long price" for land, even in the city of London. It has been obtained, however, for the site of Allhallows church, at the corner of Broad street and Watling street, for an area of 3,270 superficial feet, with the reversion to the buildings upon it in seventy-eight years hence.
