"Goods speak for themselves." But it is only after they are bought that they can do so. An object in advertising is to induce people to buy them and test them. If goods speak for themselves, a good advertisement may also speak for the goods.

Such men and the non-advertisers, "look-farmer's" were once despised by the so-called "practical" farmers, but when the latter saw the former's crops, they changed their minds.

These must be calculated for and discounted if you would bridge them over. One must make more than he needs to make a fortune, and advertising is a powerful auxiliary in money-making.

It is the most possible economy to deprive the family of a pleasure so easily and cheaply procured.
