EXECUTIVE OFFICE. SALEM, Ogn., Nov. 15, 1881.
Whereas for a long period of time custom has prevailed for setting apart a day of thanksgiving to the God of the universe:

And whereas, his excellency the president of the United States in comhe suddenly stopped and complained pliance therewith has issued his proclamation recommending "that all people observe Thursday, the 24th day of November inst., as a day of national thank-giving and prayer by ceasing so far as may be from their secular labors and meeting in their several places of worship, there to join in ascribing honor to Almighty God, whose goodburied the unfortunate deceased in a ness has been so manifest in our hiscanyon, marking the ground for tory and in our lives, and offering our honest prayers that his bounty may continue to us and our children.

Now therefore, I, W. W. Thayer, governor of the state of Oregon, in view of the foregoing and through a respect for the opinions of others, do just arrived by the State of California at Tom Smith's Oyster Salson. 
