ceive the sanction of an Act of S. F. Bulletin. Congress. With reference to the redemption of bank notes, the present regulations are thought to be needlessly intricate. There is no need for keeping tattered notes in circulation, when the cost of paper, printing and transportation are the only expenses to be met. The Government gets the benefit of all notes absolutely lost, and the number of these is large annually, more than enough to keep the currency in good condition. A safe and simple rule for the redemption of torn notes would be to give a new note for the old one, if over half of it he presented for redemption, and to take no notice of lesser portions.

The Government has never made any provisions for the redemption of worn or mutilated great demand had been made for any relief of this sort. It is estimated that silver coin with ordinary use, will last for fifty years before its eligibility ceases. From begins. 1860 to 1876 silver coin was practically demonetized in all the states except those on the Pacific coast. 
